ORDER OF THE BOARD

On this day, the Texas Board of Nursing, hereinafter referred to as the B accepted the voluntary surrender of Registered Nurse License Number 610938, issued to JULIE ANN RETERSDORF, hereinafter referred to as Respondent. This action was taken in accordance with Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code.

Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing.

The Board makes the following Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent is currently licensed to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
2. Respondent waived representation by counsel, informal proceedings, notice and hearing.
3. Respondent received a Baccalaureate Degree in Nursing from Spaulding University, Louisville, Kentucky, on May 1, 1983. Respondent was licensed to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas on October 31, 1994.

4. Respondent's nursing employment history includes:

5. At the time of the incidents in Findings of Fact Number Six (6), Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with Hospice Austin, Austin, Texas, and had been in this position approximately one (1) year and nine (9) months.
6. On September 15, 2010, the Board provided notice to Respondent regarding the following allegations:
 - On or about March 2010, through June, 2010, while employed with Hospice Austin, Austin, Texas, Respondent failed to provide and/or document nursing care she provided to patients assigned to your care.
 - On or about July 12, 2010, while employed with Hospice Austin, Austin, Texas, Respondent lacked fitness to practice professional nursing in that she exhibited

impaired behavior while on duty, including, but not limited to; disheveled appearance, trembling hands, and glassy eyes.

- On or about July 12, 2010, while employed with Hospice Austin, Austin, Texas, Respondent engaged in the intemperate use of alcohol while on duty in that she produced a positive Breathalyzer reading for alcohol. Additionally, Respondent admitted to her employer that she had been drinking wine prior to reporting for duty.
7. On April 27, 2011, the Board received a notarized statement from Respondent voluntarily surrendering the right to practice nursing in Texas. A copy of Respondent's notarized statement, dated April 25, 2011, is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Order.
 8. The Board policy implementing Rule 213.29 in effect on the date of this Agreed Order provides discretion by the Executive Director for consideration of conditional reinstatement after proof of twelve (12) consecutive months of abstinence from alcohol and drugs followed by licensure limitations/stipulations and/or peer assistance program participation.
 9. The Board finds that there exists serious risks to public health and safety as a result of impaired nursing care due to intemperate use of controlled substances or chemical dependency.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violations of Section 301.452(b)(9), (10)&(13) Texas Occupations Code, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(B)&(1)(D), and TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(1)(B),(4),(5),(10)(A),(10)(D)&(11)(B).
4. Under Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code, the Board has the authority to accept the voluntary surrender of a license.
5. Under Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, the Board may impose conditions for reinstatement of licensure.
6. Any subsequent reinstatement of this license will be controlled by Section 301.452 (b), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TAC §§213.26-.29, and any amendments thereof in effect at the time of the reinstatement.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the voluntary surrender of Registered Nurse License Number 610938, heretofore issued to JULIE ANN RETERSDORF, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas, is accepted by the Executive Director on behalf of the Texas Board of Nursing. In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice professional nursing, use the title of Registered or the abbreviation RN or wear any insignia identifying herself as a registered nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a registered nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until: one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order; and, RESPONDENT has obtained objective, verifiable proof of twelve (12) consecutive months of sobriety immediately preceding the petition.
3. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

Dear Texas Board of Nursing:


