



Respondent's professional nursing employment history continued:

6. At the time of the incidents, Respondent was employed as a registered nurse with Parkland Hospital, Dallas, Texas, and had been in this position for seven (7) months.
7. On or about April 12, 2010, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Parkland Hospital, Dallas, Texas, Respondent lacked fitness to practice professional nursing, in that while on duty, she was unable to recognize critical situations, had delayed mental responses, and was unable to prioritize patient care. Respondent's condition could have affected her ability to recognize subtle signs, symptoms or changes in patients' conditions, and could have affected her ability to make rational, accurate, and appropriate assessments, judgements, and decisions regarding patient care, thereby placing the patients in potential danger.
8. On or about April 4, 2010, while employed as a Registered Nurse with Parkland Hospital, Dallas, Texas, Respondent failed to accurately document the assessments of Patient Medical Record Number 1231447 and failed to administer Lasix and Heparin as ordered by the physician. Respondent's conduct resulted in an inaccurate, incomplete medical record, and was likely to injure the patients in that subsequent care givers would rely on her documentation while providing care to the patient. In addition, Respondent's conduct exposed the patient unnecessarily to a risk of harm from a delay of treatment of her disease process.
9. In response to Finding of Fact Number Eight (8), Respondent states: "I failed to accurately document patient assessments on two patients in the month of April 2010."
10. Respondent, by her signature to this Order, expresses her desire to voluntarily surrender her license to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.

2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of Section 301.452(b)(10),(12)&(13), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(D). and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A),(E),(4),(5)&(10)(A).
4. The evidence received is sufficient cause pursuant to Section 301.453(a), Texas Occupations Code, to take disciplinary action against Registered Nurse License Number 752102, heretofore issued to LISA KAY MCCLANAHAN, including revocation of Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Texas.
5. Under Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code, the Board has the authority to accept the voluntary surrender of a license.
6. Under Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, as amended, the Board may impose conditions for reinstatement of licensure.
7. Any subsequent reinstatement of this license will be controlled by Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §213.26-.29, and any amendments thereof in effect at the time of the reinstatement.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED and ORDERED that the VOLUNTARY SURRENDER of Registered Nurse License Number 752102, heretofore issued to LISA KAY MCCLANAHAN, to practice nursing in the State of Texas, is accepted by the Texas Board of Nursing. In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

1. RESPONDENT SHALL immediately deliver the wallet-sized license, heretofore issued to LISA KAY MCCLANAHAN, to the office of the Texas Board of Nursing.
2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice professional nursing, use the title "registered nurse" or the abbreviation "RN" or wear any insignia identifying herself as a registered nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a registered nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
3. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until:

one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order.

4. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice nursing in the State of Texas.

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RESPONDENT'S CERTIFICATION

I understand that I have the right to legal counsel prior to signing this Agreed Order. I waive representation by counsel. I have reviewed this Order. I neither admit nor deny the violation alleged herein. By my signature on this Order, I agree to the Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order, and any conditions of said Order, to avoid further disciplinary action in this matter. I waive judicial review of this Order. I understand that this Order becomes final when accepted by the Executive Director at which time the terms of this Order become effective and a copy will be mailed to me.
