

Respondent's nursing employment history continued:

5. At the time of the initial incident, Respondent was employed as a Registered Nurse with Austin State Hospital, Austin, Texas, and had been in this position for one (1) year and nine (9) months.
6. On February 12, 2009, Respondent was provided notice of the following allegations:
 - on or about October 14, 2008, Respondent failed to notify the physician or document that Client #27673 was exhibiting aggressive behavior, which was vital to ascertain the level of the dangerousness of the client. When informed that Client #27673 had attempted to strike another staff member and the staff member placed the patient in a 1-2 minute personal hold, Respondent failed to notify the physician or get an order for the restraint, complete an Intervention Progress Note one hour after the restraint took place or document the incident in the client's medical record;
 - on or about June 5, 2008, Respondent failed to assess and evaluate a patient that was being discharged, including ensuring the patient had their discharge medications and discharge instructions regarding medications and follow-up appointments; and
 - on or about June 10, 2008, Respondent documented she had given Client 166731 an inhaler at 0835 but failed to document an assessment of Client 166731's symptoms. Later, the client complained of tightness in the chest, Respondent gave the patient Benadryl instead of the inhaler per the physician's order. Additionally, when the patient complained of tightness of the chest, Respondent told him to "go away

because she was trying to get her work done." Consequently, the client became so distressed that the client went outside on the patio and broke a glass office window because she would not give the client the inhaler. Respondent's conduct caused emotional harm to the client.

7. On February 15, 2011, the Board received a statement from Respondent voluntarily surrendering the right to practice nursing in Texas. A copy of Respondent's statement, dated February 15, 2011, is attached and incorporated herein by reference as part of this Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to Texas Occupations Code, Sections 301.451-301.555, the Board has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. Notice was served in accordance with law.
3. The evidence received is sufficient to prove violation of Section 301.452(b)(10) & (13), Texas Occupations Code, 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.11(1)(B)(C)(D)(M)&(P) and 22 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §217.12(1)(A) & (B), (4)&(6)(C).
4. Under Section 301.453(c), Texas Occupations Code, the Board has the authority to accept the voluntary surrender of a license.
5. Under Section 301.453(d), Texas Occupations Code, the Board may impose conditions for reinstatement of licensure.
6. Any subsequent reinstatement of this license will be controlled by Section 301.452 (b), Texas Occupations Code, and 22 TAC §§213.26-.29, and any amendments thereof in effect at the time of the reinstatement.

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ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the voluntary surrender of Registered Nurse License Number 430193, heretofore issued to GLORIA JEAN GREENLEAF, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas, is accepted by the Executive Director on behalf of the Texas Board of Nursing. In connection with this acceptance, the Board imposes the following conditions:

1. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT practice nursing, use the title of registered nurse or the abbreviation RN or wear any insignia identifying herself as a registered nurse or use any designation which, directly or indirectly, would lead any person to believe that RESPONDENT is a registered nurse during the period in which the license is surrendered.
2. RESPONDENT SHALL NOT petition for reinstatement of licensure until: one (1) year has elapsed from the date of this Order.
3. Upon petitioning for reinstatement, RESPONDENT SHALL satisfy all then existing requirements for relicensure.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED and ORDERED that this Order SHALL be applicable to Respondent's nurse licensure compact privileges, if any, to practice professional nursing in the State of Texas.
